UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA METEOROLOGY PROFESSOR ELECTED TO A TERM ON THE COUNCIL ON GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

NORMAN, Okla.—University of Oklahoma meteorology professor Kelvin Droegemeier has been elected to a three-year term on the Council on Governmental Relations board of directors.

The COGR is an association of approximately 150 research universities with the primary function of providing advice and information to its membership while also making sure that federal agencies understand academic operations and the impact that proposed regulations will have on colleges and universities.

“The election of Kelvin to this national leadership position is further recognition by the national academic community of his abilities and many contributions to higher education and research,” said John Snow, OU College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences dean.

The COGR’s board of directors is composed of no more than 21 institution representatives with the responsibility of assuring continuity and stability within the organization. Board members are chosen based on their expertise in their chosen field of academics, business or research administration, and their ability to speak on behalf of their institution.

Droegemeier received his undergraduate degree in meteorology from OU in 1980 and his graduate degrees from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign; he joined the OU faculty in 1985. At OU, he also serves as a Regents' Professor of Meteorology, Weathernews Chair of Applied Meteorology and associate vice president for research at the university. Additionally, he is serving a six-year term on the National Science Board.
